She is a contributing opinion writer for The New York Times. She is the author of the books Ayiti; An Untamed State; the New York Times bestselling Bad Feminist; and Difficult Women and Hunger, forthcoming in 2017. Roxane is also the author of Marvel's World of Wakanda.

Randa Jarrar's work has appeared in *The New York Times Magazine*, *The Utne Reader*, *Salon.com*, *Guernica*, *The Rumpus*, *The Oxford American*, *Ploughshares*, *The Sun*, and others. Her first book, the Arab-American coming of age novel, *A Map of Home*, is now on many college syllabi. Her new book, *Him, Me, Muhammad Ali*, was named one of the Most Anticipated Books of 2016 by *The Millions*, and one of *Electric Literature*'s 25 best collections of the year. Randa runs RAWI (the Radius of Arab-American Writers) and loves coordinating events and strengthening communities.
